

## The Geographia works of Claudius Ptolemy in the A.E. Nordenskiöld Collection up to 1900

The A. E. Nordenskiöld Collection contains a total of 53 *Geographia* works by Claudius Ptolemy and one manuscript from the 15<sup>th</sup> century. 15<sup>th</sup> century: 7, 16<sup>th</sup> century: 30 (+ 1 duplicate, 1 incomplete and 1 variant), 17<sup>th</sup> century: 6 (+1 incomplete), 18<sup>th</sup> century: 1, and 19<sup>th</sup> century: 5.

The data on the *Geographia* works are from the catalogue entitled The A. E. Nordenskiöld Collection in the Helsinki University Library. Annotated Catalogue of Maps made up to 1800. Vol. II. - Compiled by Ann-Mari Mickwitz, Leena Miekkaavaara and Tuula Rantanen. Helsinki 1981. P. 150-218. The data is in the following order: year of printing, place of publishing, printer, editor, number of maps, height and signum of the work and the numbers of the works in the catalogue (Cat. II. No.) and in the A. E. Nordenskiöld Facsimile Atlas 1889 (Facs. -Atlas).
