

Clippings on Finland

1. The Ministry for Foreign Affairs clippings collection 1919-61

The collection contains 1300 cases of newspaper articles on Finland, starting from the early years of Finnish independence and extending until 1961. Articles and pictures have been collected from both Finnish and foreign newspapers. About a third of the material consists of articles and news on Finland that Finnish embassies have collected from foreign newspapers. The clippings are organised in chronological order according to country. Whereas the clippings from some of the most important countries for Finland form a relatively continuous series, the clippings from many other countries are rather random. The clippings on Finland from 1919 to 1926 were furnished by the Finnish News Agency and are systematically organised into 13 categories. From 1927 on the clippings came from the General Staff of the Defence Forces and the Ministry for Foreign Affairs Press Department. 1300 cases. The materials are preserved in the Urajärvi Deposit Library.

2. Clippings 1899-1917 The Ministry for Foreign Affairs clippings collection contains a selection of 100 scrapbooks from the last decades of Finnish autonomy under Russian rule. Half of the scrapbooks contain clippings collected from Finnish newspapers and the other half is composed of clippings on Finland from the Swedish, British, French and German press as well as from the press of a few other countries. The collection was acquired between 1925 and 26 from the estate of Hugo Lindén. 100 scrapbooks. The materials are preserved in the Urajärvi Deposit Library.

3. Finland in the British press 1899-1914

Vol. I 1899-1910 and Vol. II 1910-14 .

A collection of British newspaper articles, focusing on events in Finland and collected by Julio Reuter. The time period is not comprehensively covered, as clippings were not collected every year. There are some deficiencies in the source data of the clippings. Two scrapbooks.

4. 4. Finland 1919

Articles and news clippings on Finland collected from foreign newspapers, mainly French, in 1919. One scrapbook.

5. Clippings on Finland from the foreign press (Argus) 1962-92 Commissioned by the National Library of Finland, the Swiss-based international clipping service Argus provided clippings on Finland from the foreign, mainly Central European and North American, press. The clipping service covers the entire world, but the Soviet and Russian press are not included. The clippings are in chronological order and primarily glued on cardboard. 118 scrapbooks and cases.

6. Clippings from Soviet/Russian newspapers 1961-93 A collection of clippings on Finland collected from Soviet newspapers between 1961 and 1991 and from Russian newspapers between 1991 and 1993. The articles and news clippings were collected by the Library for Foreign Literature in Moscow. There are relatively few clippings from the 1960s, but the clippings become more extensive from 1972 on. The collection contains newspaper articles on the Finnish economy, politics, culture and sports. The collection is organised in chronological order and primarily glued on cardboard. There is an index for materials from between 1961 and 1968. 31 cases.

7. Kaarina Dehls clippings collection 1961-

Since 1961, Hamburg-based Kaarina Dehls (née Rytönen) has provided the Library with Finland-related clippings from West German newspapers, especially from Hamburg. The clippings are unglued, in rough chronological order; some years are organised according to topic. 43 cases, the collection keeps accumulating.
