Linking to electronic resources

❖ Field 856 is the key field

- **856 – Electronic Location and Access**
 - **Indicator 2 ((Relationship) is key indicator**
 - » 0 – Resource
 - » 1 – Version of resource
 - » 2 – Related resource
 - **Key subfields**
 - \$u – Uniform Resource Identifier (URI)
 - \$z – Public note
 - \$3 – Materials specified OR \$y – Link text

❖ Leader position 6 (Type of Record)

- **Code for content, not carrier**

Models

❖ Record describes an electronic resource

- Ebook
- Electronic resource digitized from a print resource but record is only for electronic
- Collection record for a group of electronic resources
- Web site
- Use 856 with Ind2=0 (Resource) to link to e-resource
 - Optionally include \$y with link text
- Leader 6 indicates content, e.g., if text, then “a” (language material)

Examples – 856 Ind 2 = 0 (Resource)

❖ Electronic journal

- **User display:**
 - Links: [Resource](#) (generated from 2nd indicator)

❖ Collection of electronic materials

- 245 00 \$a September 11 Web archive \$h [electronic resource]
- 856 40 \$u <http://hdl.loc.gov/loc.natlib/collnatlib.00000001>
\$ycollection
- **User display:**
 - Links: [Collection](#) (generated from \$y)

Models

- ❖ **Record describes a print resource and adds link to an electronic version**
 - Digitized printed book
 - Use 856 with Ind 2=1 (Version of resource)
 - Optionally include \$y to indicate what the version is
- ❖ **Record describes a print resource and adds link to an electronic part of resource**
 - Electronic sample text from a printed book
 - Digitized pictures from a printed item
 - Image of Table of Contents from a printed item
 - Use 856 with Ind 2=1 (Version of resource)
 - Include \$3 or \$y to indicate the part
- ❖ **In both cases Leader/6 indicates “type” for the print item**

Examples – 856 Ind 2 = 1 (Version)

Models

- ❖ **Record has links to related electronic resources**
 - Publisher description of the resource
 - Biographic information about author
 - EAD Finding aid for the collections described in the record
 - Use 856 with Ind 2=2 (Related resource)
 - Use \$3 or \$y to indicate what the related item is
- ❖ **Leader/6 related to the item cataloged in the record**

Examples – 856 Ind 2 = 2 (Related resource)
